Questions & Answers

- From the Notice inviting proposals: On page 3 of the RFP, the City states, "Each Proponent must be licensed in accordance with applicable California State Law." Would the City please state what licenses would be applicable to firms and/or staff performing work on this contract?
 Proponents must coordinate directly with the State of California to ensure they meet all applicable licensure requirements to execute the Scope of Services outlined in the RFP. A City of Stockton Business license may be required for this project. Proponents may contact the City of Stockton Business License Division at (209) 937-8313 for additional information.
- 2. 4.0 PROPOSAL GUIDELINES, CONTENT AND FORMAT: On page 7 of the RFP, the City states, "The original proposal must have wet ink signatures. Modification to a proposal after the proposal submittal deadline will not be accepted by the City." Given that the City has elsewhere indicated that the proposal is to be submitted electronically, would DocuSign be an acceptable means of providing signatures?
 - Yes. However, the only exception would be the notarized affidavit, which can be scanned and sent electronically.
- 3. Have you determined a budget for the project? If so, can you share it and the funding source? Currently, this project is designated to be funded through the General Fund. The budget for this project may vary based on the breadth of each After Action Report. Proponents may provide tiered pricing for varying intensities of each After Action Report.
- 4. Can you estimate the number of people who were involved in the incident and would be involved in the AAR process?
 - There are approximately 20-25 people involved with the City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

5. Is the timeline for the project fixed at 12 months? No. The California Code of Regulations (Tit. 19, §2450) requires any city, city and county, or county declaring a local emergency for which the governor proclaims a state of emergency, and any state agency responding to that emergency, to complete and transmit an after action report to Cal OES within ninety (90) days of the close of the incident period as specified in California Code of Regulations, Title 19, § 2900(p).
