Firefighting involves vigorous, skilled physical work and continuous training to handle emergency and situations. In addition to fighting fires and rescuing citizens, fire fighters:

- work with citizens to promote fire prevention,
- provide emergency medical care (both first responder and paramedic),
- perform fire-suppression activities,
- perform water rescue,
- protect the environment from hazardous material incidents,
- perform heavy rescue operations from cars and collapsed buildings, and
- conduct and participate in training programs to stay current on firefighting technology and methods.

Fire Fighter Qualifications

- 18 years of age or older.
- High school graduate or possess a G.E.D.
- Successfully pass a medical exam, vision, hearing and drug screening.
- Pass written, oral and physical ability tests.
- Have valid California Class "C" Driver's License and obtain Class "B" Restricted Driver's License within one year of appointment.
- Possess (or acquire within one year of employment) certification as Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) - Basic. EMT Basic Training provided at Academy (if offered).
- Legally authorized to work in the United States.
- Pass comprehensive background investigation and psychological assessment, polygraph, and fingerprinting.
- Reside within a geographic area to reach City Hall within 45 minutes.

Career Opportunities

- Paramedic As a firefighter, become part of an ever-growing, advanced Emergency Medical System.
- **Hazardous Materials Team** Train as a Haz-Mat Technician or Specialist for hazardous materials mitigation and awareness.
- Water Rescue Team Specialize in Swift Water Rescue or Dive Rescue Certified and provide water safety on the waterways surrounding our community.
